The principal fault to be found with pasteurization as at present carried out, is that in some instances there is a blind application of the process, without a thorough understanding by the operators of the principals involved. Some types of apparatus are so faulty in their construction that the most careful operator is unable to get satisfactory results. In many instances there is an entire lack of any kind of laboratory control. The lack of laboratory control is due in part to the fact that the bacterial count is somewhat difficult to apply, requiring as it does a trained technician and considerable equipment. In hopes of finding a simple method which might be used to follow the milk from the raw stage through the heating, holding, and cooling process, the writer has attempted an application of the pH method used by Cooledge and Wyant...
